READ THIS FIRST: WHERE YOU STAND RIGHT NOW

- You are **past all contact restrictions**. College coaches can call, text, DM, and email you today — and you can contact them. Nothing is holding this up but you.
- Official visits are available to you now. Use them.
- First signing date: **Nov 12, 2026**. That is your anchor — work backward from it.
- You enroll fall 2027, which puts you **fully under the new eligibility rules with no grandfathering**. See Section E before you commit anywhere.
- Most programs carry only **2–3 goalkeepers**. Roster depth and graduating keepers matter more than the name on the sweatshirt.

This is a working document. Fill it in, mark it up, keep it in your bag. The keeper who tracks the process is the keeper who controls it.

SECTION R — RULE ALERTS: 2026-27 CONFIRMED DATES

The 2026-27 NCAA Division I recruiting calendar for "Other Sports" is published (updated Aug 4, 2026). These dates are confirmed — put them in your phone right now.

■ FIRST SIGNING DATE — NOV 12, 2026

A verbal offer is not a scholarship. **The paper is the scholarship.**

Calendars move. Verify at ncaa.org and eligibilitycenter.org before you book a flight.

■ PROPOSED RULE — NOT ADOPTED: TWO-SEMESTER SEASON

Every men's keeper in this class is hearing rumors about a spring season. Here is exactly where it stands.

- The D1 Men's Soccer Oversight Committee adopted a two-semester model on **May 13, 2026**.
- On **June 24, 2026** the D1 Cabinet **REMANDED** it back for further review. 20 conferences formally opposed, citing season duration, unclear related rules, and championship-selection impact.
- **As of September 6, 2026 it is NOT adopted.** No new effective date, no new vote scheduled. The NCAA.org article still reads "DI Cabinet remands two-semester men's soccer proposal to oversight committee for further review."
- What was *proposed*: fall segment late Aug → Saturday before Thanksgiving, max 18 contests; spring mid-February → Championship, up to 10; College Cup moves to spring; transfer window becomes one 15-consecutive-day spring window replacing the 45-day split.
- ■ The 18 and 10 are **segment maximums — NOT additive**. Overall cap is 25 contests including exhibitions.
- Currently in force: **fall-only calendar** and the **45-day two-window transfer structure**.
- Ask every program how they're planning for *both* scenarios.

MY NOTES / QUESTIONS ON THESE RULES

SECTION E — ELIGIBILITY CLOCK: READ THIS BEFORE YOU COMMIT ANYWHERE

■ CLASS OF 2027 — THE NEW RULES APPLY TO YOU WITH NO GRANDFATHERING

Athletes with eligibility remaining after 2025-26, or enrolling in 2026-27, could pick whichever system helped them most. **Anyone initially enrolling full-time in fall 2027 or later gets the new model only. That is you.** No opt-out, no legacy path, no waiver waiting.

The new Division I age-based model (adopted June 23, 2026)

- A **single continuous five-year clock**. It starts at the **earlier** of: (a) your first full-time enrollment at *any* college — domestic, international, or two-year/JUCO — or (b) the academic year following your 19th birthday.
- It **does not pause** because you don't compete, sit out, transfer, or change teams. The clock runs while you watch.
- "Seasons of competition" is gone as a concept. **So is the redshirt.**
- **Waivers were eliminated** — medical hardship, extension of eligibility, season-of-competition, athletics activity, delayed enrollment. The old-rule window closed July 31, 2026.
- Only three exceptions remain, all via the Eligibility Center: **pregnancy, active-duty military service, official religious mission.**

■ THE NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER STATES PLAINLY:

Calling this the "5 for 5 rule" is **not accurate** — it does not guarantee five years to everyone, especially anyone who delays enrollment. A continuous clock is not five guaranteed seasons.

■ THINKING ABOUT A GAP YEAR, POST-GRAD YEAR, OR A SEASON OVERSEAS? READ THIS TWICE.

NCAA's own wording: *"Delaying college enrollment beyond age 19 may reduce the amount of eligibility available in Divisions I and II."*

Enrolling full-time at a university abroad starts your NCAA clock — even while you're trialing. Most families have no idea.

JUCO counts. Every semester of full-time two-year-college enrollment burns clock.

Where each division stands

Level	Eligibility structure for a 2027 enrollee
D1	Age-based model — a single continuous 5-year clock, as described above.
D2	Adopted the same age-based model, announced Aug 5, 2026, effective immediately for 2026-27 . The old "4 seasons within 10 semesters / 15 quarters" rule no longer applies in D2.
D3	The only division still on 10 semesters / 15 quarters — 4 seasons of competition inside the first 10 semesters (or 15 quarters) of full-time enrollment.
NAIA	Its own system: 10 semesters / 12 trimesters / 15 quarters of terms of attendance, plus 4 seasons per sport.
JUCO	Time spent counts against your NCAA clock. See the note below.

■ THE JUCO QUESTION, ANSWERED STRAIGHT

JUCO time counts. Both the new D1 and D2 models start the clock at first full-time enrollment at any college, **including two-year colleges**. The Pavia case produced individual relief plus a one-time NCAA waiver in 2024-25 — it did **not** change the rule, and the amended complaint is still pending with no ruling. JUCO can still be a genuinely good development path for a keeper who needs reps — just **plan as if every semester counts**, because right now it does.

■ THESE RULES ARE UNDER ACTIVE LEGAL CHALLENGE

Multiple lawsuits followed adoption. Three produced sweeping injunctions — all three have now been stayed: Borovicanin (Aug 17, 2026), Wisne nationwide (Aug 21, 2026), Washington v. NCAA (Aug 26, 2026). Dozens of smaller state-court cases remain active and application can still be inconsistent. **Re-confirm your situation with each school's compliance office before you sign anything.**

Smart moves for a keeper in this class

- **The redshirt play is gone for you.** Sitting a year no longer preserves anything — the clock runs regardless. Factor that into where you'll actually get minutes.
- Ask about the GK depth chart *before* the campus tour: how many keepers, what year each is, who's graduating.
- **Every year off the field still costs you a year.** Pick a program where you can compete for minutes inside five years.
- Get it in writing from **compliance**, not the recruiting coordinator.

If your reel is older than this fall's film, fix that before you send another email. A senior sending sophomore-year clips tells a coach everything he needs to know — and none of it is good.

SECTION 2 — NIL: WHAT YOU CAN AND CANNOT DO RIGHT NOW

■ TEXAS UIL RULES (HB 126) — IF YOU'RE STILL PLAYING HIGH SCHOOL BALL

16 or under: you may NOT sign an NIL agreement with anyone. Neither may a family member on your behalf.

17 or older: you MAY sign — but ONLY with a postsecondary institution.

Any NIL agreement with any other entity may not be executed until you have exhausted your UIL eligibility in that sport.

Plain English: a UIL-eligible keeper **cannot** take a paid deal from a glove brand, a local business, or a training academy while still playing high school soccer.

UIL does not prohibit hiring professional NIL representation.

■ NIL GO — FOR D1-BOUND KEEPERS

All third-party deals worth **\$600 or more** must be reported — counting from July 1, 2025 or the start of your junior year, whichever is later. Multiple payments from the same payer aggregate toward \$600. Reporting runs through **NIL Go**, operated by the College Sports Commission.

- **Before enrollment:** report within 14 days of starting full-time classes, or before your first D1 game — whichever comes first.

- **After enrollment:** any new third-party deal of \$600+ must be reported within **5 business days** of signing it.

Enforcement is real: roughly \$90M in deals rejected against \$355M approved.

■ CRITICAL — THE "UP TO 28" NUMBER HAS A CATCH

"Up to 28" only applies at schools **participating in the House settlement**. Non-participating D1 programs are still under the old limits — **9.9 for men, 14 for women**.

All Power 4 and Pac-12 schools participate automatically; everyone else **opts in annually by May 1**. Ask which side of that line a program is on, and how many scholarships they actually fund. *Authorized and funded are two different words.*

Scholarship types — quick key

- Full Athletic — rare in soccer at any level. Don't build your plan around it.
- Partial Athletic — the most common outcome at D1 and D2.
- **Preferred Walk-On (PWO)** — a real strategy, especially this late in a cycle. A roster spot, a locker, and a chance to earn funding later.
- D3 need- and merit-based aid — no athletic money, but a strong academic package can beat a partial athletic offer outright.

Note: NAIA's registration portal had an outage in late August 2026. If playnaia.org won't load, call **816-595-8300**.

SECTION 4 — NCAA ELIGIBILITY CENTER: DO THIS THIS WEEK

If you're pursuing D1 or D2 and haven't registered, this is your most urgent task — **you cannot sign or receive athletics aid without it**.

Your registration checklist

- Create or confirm the right account type
- Test scores submitted where required
- 16 NCAA-approved core courses on track

- Fee paid or waiver requested
- Transcript sent by your counselor
- Certified period of eligibility shows in your account

Fees are nonrefundable after 30 days — current amounts are listed at eligibilitycenter.org. The NCAA now certifies a period of eligibility for students initially enrolling fall 2026 and later. Log in and check yours.

SECTION 5 — YOUR MONTH-BY-MONTH COUNTDOWN TO SIGNING

Forget grade-by-grade planning. You have one cycle left. Here is the calendar.

NOW — LATE AUGUST / SEPTEMBER 2026

- Register with the NCAA Eligibility Center
- Cut a current highlight reel from this fall's film
- Build the target list in Section 7
- Send your first outreach wave
- Get your full fall schedule to every coach on the list

- Follow up on every unanswered email
- Take official and unofficial visits — get on campus
- Ask the GK depth-chart questions in Section 11

NOVEMBER 2026

- ■ Nov 9–12 is a DEAD PERIOD — no in-person contact, but email, calls, and texts stay open
- Nov 12: first signing date for a written offer of athletics aid
- Compare offers side by side — confirm funding in writing

- Dec 11–14 dead period (D1 Championship)
- Dec 23–25 quiet period — on-campus contact only
- Use it for film and email, not travel
- Watch the transfer portal — GK spots open here

JANUARY – FEBRUARY 2027

- Second wave on D2, D3, NAIA and JUCO programs
- Late openings surface after the portal's fall window closes
- Revisit preferred walk-on conversations

MARCH – MAY 2027

- Spring signing window — confirm current dates at ncaa.org
- Finalize your decision
- Get every funding commitment in writing before you sign

■ BEFORE YOU SIGN — NON-NEGOTIABLE

Call the school's **compliance office** and confirm your eligibility clock in writing. Do not rely on the recruiting coordinator. Compliance is the office that has to live with the answer.

SECTION 6 — WHERE CLASS OF 2027 SPOTS ACTUALLY STILL EXIST

This is the honest conversation. Late in a cycle is not the same as out of options — it just means you have to be smarter about where you spend your energy.

- Many D1 spots for 2027 are already verbally committed. **That's the market, not a verdict.**
- Most programs carry **2–3 keepers**. A roster with a graduating senior keeper is worth ten with a stacked depth chart. Research depth AND graduation before you spend an email.
- **The transfer portal cuts both ways.** Programs use it to fill GK needs — but it also opens spots late. Current structure, unchanged for 2026-27: a **30-day fall window** opening shortly after championship selections, plus a **15-day spring window May 1–15**, for 45 days total. A coaching change triggers a separate **30-day window** from the day the departure is announced. D2 and D3 have no fixed windows.
- **D2, D3, NAIA and JUCO recruit later** — into senior year and beyond. D3 has no contact restrictions at all; you can email a D3 coach tonight.
- **PWO is a real path.** Ask directly: what would it take to earn funded status by year two?

SECTION 9 — DEAD PERIOD STRATEGY + YOUR EMAIL

Most families go quiet during a dead period. That is exactly backwards — and it is the single biggest free advantage available to you all year.

✗ NOT ALLOWED

- Face-to-face contact with recruits or parents, on or off campus
- In-person evaluations — coaches cannot attend your games, showcases, or ID camps

✓ STILL ALLOWED

- Email, DMs, texts, and phone calls
- As a senior you're past every contact restriction, so the conversation never has to stop. Only the in-person part pauses.

Why a dead period favors keepers

- Coaches are at a desk instead of on the road, so response rates rise.
- Film is the **only evaluation tool** in that window — a great reel from a small club gets the same look as a big-club keeper. Film also shows what live viewing misses: footwork, set position, distribution, decisions on crosses.
- Most families go silent, so your email lands in a quiet inbox.
- It's a natural, non-pushy reason to reach out.

■ REALITY CHECK — MEN'S SOCCER

Your dead periods are **November** (signing week) and **December** (Championship) — mid-season and championship crunch, not preseason. Coaches are managing their own postseason and their signing class at once. Send **short**, and expect **slow replies**. A slow reply is not a rejection.

- Name the graduating keeper if there is one. It shows you did the roster work.

■ KNOWN LIMITS — WHAT IS NOT FULLY CONFIRMED

Washington v. NCAA stay (Aug 26, 2026) — This is the **weakest-sourced claim in the document**. The Borovicainin and Wisne stays are confirmed by a law-firm legal update. The Washington stay was reported by a sports-law commentator and secondary outlets, not a primary court document or NCAA statement. Treat the date as reported, not confirmed.

Holiday window: Dec 23–25 quiet vs. Dec 24–26 dead — The official 2026-27 NCAA calendar PDF shows **Dec 23–25 as a quiet period** for men's soccer. NCSA's 2026-27 summary shows **Dec 24–26 as a dead period**. The two disagree on both dates and period type. Low practical risk, but verify before planning travel.
